Melissa Ziobro is the Specialist Professor of Public History in the Monmouth University Department of History and Anthropology and the primary point of contact for the University's public history minor. She runs the Department's social media and newsletter and the Monmouth Memories Oral History Program. She serves as the campus coordinator for the National History Day program, and is the faculty advisor for the History and Anthropology Club.

She currently serves as the President of Oral History in the Mid-Atlantic Region and as the editor for New Jersey Studies: An Interdisciplinary Journal, a joint venture of the NJ Historical Commission, Rutgers University Libraries, and Monmouth University. She is a trustee of the NJ Vietnam Veterans Memorial Foundation and the Ocean County Historical Society, and serves on committees for both the NJ Historical Commission and Preservation NJ. She works regularly with other public history organizations such as the Monmouth County Park System, Monmouth County Historical Association, Monmouth County Historical Commission, Middlesex County Office of Culture and Heritage, National Guard Militia Museum of NJ, and more.
