John D'Luhy is a 1955 graduate of Trinity College, Philadelphia, and continued his education at the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania. D'Luhy received his M.B.A. from Wharton in 1959.

After leaving graduate school, D'Luhy joined Merrill Lynch and began his career in investment banking. He went on to work at Lazard Frères and served as a senior partner at R.W. Pressprich Investment Bankers. He founded several companies and was heavily involved in the investment market. He is now a private investor and is listed in Who's Who in America, Who's Who in the World, and Who's Who in Finance and Industry.

A man of many interests, he is a licensed amateur radio operator and commercial pilot (instrument-rated). As a licensed radio operator, D'Luhy was a founding member of the Ocean Monmouth Amateur Radio Club, which is now located at InfoAge. He went to the US Navy Officer's Candidate School in 1955 and was a

founding member of the Naval War College Foundation in 1969 where he served as Chairman, Treasurer and served on several committees; he is now a Trustee Emeritus of the Foundation. He is an Honorary Usher at St. Patrick's Cathedral in NYC, a member of the NYC University Club, the Spring Lake Bath and Tennis Club, the Jersey Aero Club, the Clayton (New York) Yacht Club, and the American Radio Relay League.

D'Luhy served as the Treasurer of InfoAge from 2015 through 2018 and initiated financial programs that greatly improved the knowledge of the Board as to InfoAge's financial picture, budget, and funding stream. He also served as the Chairman of the Governance Committee where he refined the InfoAge By-Laws.
